Whether to entertain, educate, heal, or resolve conflict, stories are the most fundamental way that people connect. The power of storytelling is unquestionable, and recognizing stories as creative expression helps to better understand the anxieties, dreams, and aspirations that link humanity with community building.

Certainly, trauma and turmoil affect our stories, but they do not define them. Narratives of fear and pain can be transformed into stories of power and resilience.

Areas to Consider

The Power of Storytelling in a Complex World

- **Storytelling fosters belonging and empathy.** Stories empowers and enriches us, helping us build communities that realize the power of change, together.

Storytelling as a Human Practice
